Peregrine Falcon



I took this picture at Deer Lagoon, Whidbey Island, WA. The bird was hunting just a bit above eye level, and the angle shows its amazing aerodynamic shape.

I did a search to see if peregrines did anything newsworthy in 2023. Most of the reports had to do with peregrines taking up residence in major cities. My favorite of these was from Chicago, in the downtown business district. The falcons had chicks in the nest and were driving off unsuspecting people walking by on the sidewalk.
