"Dunlin, curlew sandpiper *Calidris ferruginea*, sanderling *Calidris alba*, and little stint *Calidris minuta* commonly use distal rhynchokinesis [independent movement of only the tip of the bill] to strike, capture, and transport small prey items. . . . Rhynchokinesis is a mechanism that could contribute to the flexible feeding behavior of long-distance migratory shorebirds, enhancing small prey profitability and so improving foraging efficiency."
